

BC Hydro appliance rebates are back

From October 5 – November 16, 2018, BC Hydro will be providing \$25 to \$100 rebates on select ENERGY STAR® clothes washers, clothes dryers, and refrigerators. The appliances that qualify for BC Hydro rebates are the most efficient ENERGY STAR® models on the market and will help customers save power and money. Visit powersmart.ca on October 5 for a complete list of qualifying products and additional offers.

BC Hydro Rebates

SELECT ENERGY STAR® REFRIGERATORS

- \$25 rebate for ENERGY STAR® refrigerators 10% better than federal standard
- \$100 rebate for ENERGY STAR® refrigerators 15% better than federal standard
- No compact refrigerators or greater than 11 cubic feet

SELECT ENERGY STAR® CLOTHES WASHERS

- \$50 rebate for ENERGY STAR® clothes washers with IMEF of 2.92 or higher, IWF of 3.2 or less, and meet V8 specification

SELECT ENERGY STAR® CLOTHES DRYERS

- \$25 for ENERGY STAR® electric clothes dryers with CEF of 3.93
- \$100 for ENERGY STAR® electric clothes dryers with CEF of 4.3 or higher and all ENERGY STAR® gas clothes dryers

Samsung Rebates

- \$25 – \$100 rebate on all qualifying Samsung appliances at any retailer to match BC Hydro rebate.

Exclusive Samsung Rebates

- Trail Appliances will match the BC Hydro rebate on all Samsung qualifying appliances for additional savings.

Retailer Rebates

Select retailers and/or manufacturers may offer additional rebates. Check powersmart.ca/deals for additional offers.

Municipal Clothes Washer Rebates

Select municipalities will offer an additional clothes washer rebate to promote water conservation. Customers must reside in a participating municipality to qualify.

Application process

- Ensure the appliance model is listed on the qualifying product list found at powersmart.ca/appliances
- Apply online for the rebate(s) **within 60 days of purchase**
- Complete online application and upload a copy of the proof of purchase
 - Customers can choose to receive their rebates by e-transfer or by credit to their next BC Hydro bill

Merchandising

Merchandising kits will arrive in store during the last week of September. Retail stores are required to display the point-of-purchase (POP) materials for the full duration of the appliance rebate offers.

Savings Tips

CLOTHES WASHERS:

- Wash laundry in cold.
 - By switching from hot to cold water for an average of three loads per week, you could save up to \$27 per year on your energy bill.
 - Heating water accounts for 90% of the energy consumption of washing machines. An ENERGY STAR® front-loading machine can cut water use by nearly 40% and electricity use up to 65% compared to a conventional top loader.
- Run full loads.
 - Cut one load per week, even if you're already using cold water, and you could save \$30 a year of your laundry costs.

CLOTHES DRYERS:

- Hang dry your laundry.
 - If you do eight loads of laundry a week and use your clotheslines for 50% of those clothes, you could save \$65 a year.
 - Electric clothes dryers are estimated to account for approximately 12% of total electricity costs for a typical household.
- Toss a towel in the dryer.
 - A dry towel added to your dryer load can significantly reduce drying times. If you're doing seven loads a week, this could cut your drying time by 10% and save you \$27 a year.
 - Use your ENERGY STAR® dryer's eco-mode or energy saving mode.

REFRIGERATORS:

- Replace your old fridge.
 - Replace a fridge that's 10 years old or older with a new ENERGY STAR® rated model and you could save \$40 or more per year.
- Be efficient with refrigeration.
 - Keep your fridge and freezer at their ideal temperatures. For your fridge this is between 2°C and 4°C and your freezer should be at -18°C. It all adds up and could save you \$25 a year.
- Unplug your second fridge.
 - Unplug that second fridge and save up to \$90 a year.
